

Christ Church Extends \$20,000 Helping Hand

Christ Church Cranbrook is contributing \$20,000 to a pilot project of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan.

The project—building of a new church and settlement house for the Negro congregation of the Church of the Resurrection in Ecorse.

Supported by the Protestant Episcopal Church, the project represents a concerted effort to create a sense of community in a complex industrial area.

THE REV. GERALD B. O'Grady, Jr., rector of Christ Church, said: "We have included \$20,000 in our budget money for this project as an expression of our concern for the inner city."

The score church's present quarters are located in an old store building on a crowded semi-residential street. The interior of the church consists of a small room furnished with hand-me-down pews, altar fittings and an outdated piano which are all transformed by the new wood sheathing on the walls, carefully tended altar and a sense of order in the use of space.

Vicar of the church is the Rev. Henry Parker who has increased the church's membership from 32 to 300 in the last three years.

people, Rev. Parker has designed a program of action. A consultation center is conducted with the aid of volunteer social workers and a psychiatrist who provide consultation two nights a week. A day nursery, which has become a vital need in the community since so many women must work, is planned for the new church building. Long periods of unemployment for most of the congregation's men, who work in the steel mills, has resulted in many of the women taking jobs.

Informal after-school classes for children having difficulty with school grades and homemaking classes also are in the planning stage.

Despite the economic and social difficulties of the small congregation, its 300 members have expressed their enthusiasm over the plans of the new church and program by pledging \$30,000 to the building fund.

GROUND-BREAKING for the new church building is scheduled for March 4 at 4 p.m.

Rev. Parker visited Christ Church Cranbrook Feb. 6 as guest speaker for the Episcopal Church Women's meeting.
