**Oak'd Family Service Reports '61 Activities**

Last year's activity of the Family Service of Oakland County was reviewed in an annual report by executive director Robert J. James at the board of directors January meeting.

The report showed that the agency served 2,123 different families during 1961, representing an increase of four per cent over 1960. The largest percentage of families had marital problems and the second group displayed concern over children's behavior problems.

Within the last two-thirds of the year, the agency extended assistance to 1,067 children.

IN ADDITION to the increase in number of families served, the agency also took on a new program of group counseling with individual families. The program has been successful under the leadership of Mrs. Albertina Mahley of the Birmingham office that the agency plans to make it a permanent part of its program.

The board of directors also took a step forward in committing itself to extend casework services to the aging population of Oakland County. In 1962 the agency will have a specialized caseworker who will be the agency's representative in the Family Service Association of America's Project on Aging. The project will run for three years under the sponsorship of the Ford Foundation.

James reported that the agency's constant problem in 1961 was struggling to serve an increasing number of families without additional staff persons. The lack of sufficient staffers resulted from inadequate financial support from the Community Funds in Oakland County.

ACCORDING to James, unless additional funds are forthcoming, the ability of the agency to meet the increasing demand for services to families will decrease greatly in the next few years. Assurance of an outstanding achievement in 1961, from the point of view of the total community, was the establishment of the Membership Body. Any citizen in Oakland County interested in strong family life, wanting to keep in touch with what the agency is doing, may make application to the Membership Body. This has meant a larger number of citizens in Oakland County becoming volunteers and more working board committees to consider agency problems.

James C. Allen, president, said that the success of this movement is due to the excellent leadership provided by Fred W. Sanders, chairman of the Membership Body.

AS A BY-PRODUCT of the Membership Body, the Lakeland Players of Waterford Township agreed to start on a play written by Nora Stirling under the auspices of the Plays for Living Division of Family Service Association of America. The title is "Eye of a Hurricane." The Lakeland Players have already produced this play twice in Oakland County. They will be glad to produce it for any interested organization which has concern for family life.

James recognized a group of volunteers working in a clerical capacity for the agency which has meant a great saving to the community. Mrs. Grace Kreisel of Bloomfield Hills, has been with the agency for two years. Mrs. Gerald Broxton serves as a receptionist in the Pontiac office evenings. Mrs. George Caronis has done likewise in the Birmingham office. Miss Joanne Hargreaves, like Mrs. Caronis, is a Junior League volunteer, and has given many hours of service to the agency.

**Resident Receives Nat'l Recognition For Record Sales**

Gerald R. Linton, 1015 Rock Spring, Birmingham, district sales manager for Investors Diversified Services, Inc. and its subsidiary, Investors Syndicate Life Insurance and Annuity Co., has received national recognition and an award for record sales produced during the 1961 autumn sales campaign.

For the entire year, mutual fund sales amounted to approximately \$102 million; maturity value of installment certificates sold was \$245 million; sales by ISL were \$263 million.

**Oak'd Clinics Plan Feb. 13 Annual Confab**

A program of interest to parents, educators, and civic leaders is planned for the Feb. 13 annual meeting of the Oakland Child Guidance Clinics Inc.

"The three clinics in Oakland County are conducted largely with public and donated funds, under the overall direction of a board elected by the public. For these reasons, public participation in our annual meeting is earnestly sought," said Dr. William J. Westmaas, president.

The main items of business will be conducted at the meeting, which opens at 8 p.m. in the Birmingham Unitarian Church, S. Woodward and Lone Pine Road, Bloomfield Hills. A slate of directors will be presented for public election, and a report on the activities of the clinics in 1961 will be given.

"IN ADDITION," said Dr. Westmaas, an outstanding educator, sociologist and community leader will make the evening's main address. Dr. Mel Ravitz, Wayne State University associate professor and newly elected Detroit councilman, will talk on the changes taking place in American family life.

As an expert on sociological problems in city environments, Dr. Ravitz is a prolific writer for professional and religious journals. He also has served on a score of civic committees concerned with education and community services.

"The practical problems of child-raising also are well-known to Dr. Ravitz who has five children of his own," said Dr. Westmaas.

A stimulating meeting is in store for the night of February 13, and every Oakland County citizen is cordially invited to meet with us," he said.
