Ford Motor Co. Names Area Man To English Post

Richard W. Wantin of Lathrup, has been appointed assistant executive engineer-commercial vehicle engineering for Ford Motor Co., Ltd., Dagenham, England.

Wantin has been manager of the heavy truck current model department in Ford's division's product engineering office in Dearborn since March, 1951.

Born in Finland in 1909, Mr. Wantin came to the U. S. and went to work for Ford Motor Co. as a tool and die apprentice in 1928. On completing his apprenticeship, he worked as a journeyman tool and die maker in the Rouge plant.

WITH the start of World War II, Wantin became a project engineer in the pre-production stages of Ford Motor's B-24 bomber production program, and later was general foreman of a trouble-shooting team at the Willow Run bomber plant.

Following the war, he became a project engineer in commercial vehicles, and advanced through several successive positions until he was made chief engineer-trucks, reporting to the executive engineer, in 1955. Following deactivation of Ford engineering activities in 1958, Wantin was manager of heavy truck engineering.

A GRADUATE of the technical high school in Wipuri, Finland and the Ford Engineering School in Dearborn, he is a past national vice president of the Society of Automotive Engineers, a past president of the Society of Automotive Engineers, a past president of the Finnish Businessmen's Association of Detroit and organizer of the Finlandia Male Chorus of Detroit.



J. W. Richardson Transferred By Du Pont

Air Force Reserve Brigadier General John W. Richardson, an E. L. Du Pont de Nemours and Co. executive in civilian life, has been transferred to his company's home office in Wilmington, Delaware.

Gen. Richardson, formerly of 612 Bennington, Bloomfield Hills, will continue to serve as Deputy Commander of the Fifth Air Force Reserve Center at Selfridge Air Force Base until a successor can be named.

He will commute between Wilmington and Detroit for the next few months.

Joining the company in 1931, Gen. Richardson has served in various production, engineering, and sales assignments.

His career with Du Pont was interrupted by WWII. On December 8, 1941 he volunteered for the Air Force and within three months was on his way to England. There, he served with Headquarters Eighth Air Force and the First Bombardment Division. Later, he was a liaison officer between Eighth Air Force in England and the Fifteenth Air Force in Italy.

In Italy he helped set up plans which brought about the safe return of more than 3,000 airplanes who had been downed behind enemy lines.

After 35 months overseas, the last three on an intelligence mission in the Balkans, General Richardson returned to Washington to serve on the Intelligence Staff of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

He returned to Du Pont after the war and was assigned to Detroit with the Fabrics and Finishes department.

Since WWII, General Richardson has filled various Air Force mobilization assignments with Headquarters USAF, Strategic Air Command and Tenth Air Force.

He became Deputy Commander of the Fifth Air Force Reserve Region on September 1, 1950. He was promoted to Brigadier General in the Reserve, March 7, 1951.
