dent and won letters in boxing and basketball in high school. He served in the Navy, after which he earned his B.A. and master's degrees. He studied at the Juillard School of Music in New York.

His recording of "Autumn Leaves" in 1955 opened the path to stardom. Since then, the pianist has made several records that sold over a million copies.

Embarking on his first coast-to-coast tour in November, 1958, Williams now has played concerts in more than 100 cities in the U.S. and Canada.

Williams has recorded some 20 LP albums; he spends as many as eight months a year on concert tours and appears frequently on various TV shows.

"FOR YEARS," Williams once said, "there has been a gulf between popular and classical music. I think it is more the result of tradition than desire on the part of the public."

"People who genuinely enjoy good music can appreciate the best in both the classics and jazz. I hope to build a bridge across that gap."

Williams adds, "When I play I try to tell the audience what the composer wanted to say."
