**Officials Considering New Library Facility**

Baldwin Public Library officials and Bloomfield Township officials are considering the possibility of initiating a new library facility for the township.

The idea of a new facility was discussed at a special Jan. 25 meeting designed to discuss contractual arrangements for library service. Library board vice president, Mrs. W. Ogden Vogt reviewed the current library situation regarding non-residents. She pointed out that the library board could not afford to continue sharing its library services with township residents on the present basis.

ACCORDING TO Mrs. Vogt, Bloomfield Township residents were responsible for 7.4 per cent of the library's use while contributing only 7.93 per cent of its revenue through payment for non-resident cards.

The contract recently negotiated with the Village of Beverly Hills was mentioned, and the board made it clear that it looks favorably on a contractual relationship with the township. However, the board on a course of the establishment of a

separate facility for the township, rather than serve so large an added population and area directly from the Baldwin Library.

Miss Jeanne Lloyd, library director, mentioned the advisability of a new facility with temporary quarters such as a rented store building for the first few years. She also suggested that a survey could be made first which would serve as a blueprint for future development of such a facility.

FOLLOWING A discussion of the pros and cons of a self survey as opposed to professional survey, it was decided that Miss Lloyd should obtain names of persons who may be interested in undertaking such a study.

A meeting date to further consider the matter has not been set. The library board held its regular meeting last Thursday.

**Oak'd Boy Given Red Cross Award For Life Saving**

An Oakland County boy last week became the 70th Michigan resident to receive the certificate of merit of the American Red Cross for life saving.

He is Jeffrey Janik, 13, of , who was recognized for meritorious service in applying his Red Cross water safety training to save the life of a companion, Gary Clement, 14, of Pontiac, who was stricken with severe cramps while swimming in Elizabeth Lake last Aug. 29.

The certificate, highest honor given to individuals by the Red Cross, was presented Feb. 10 by Carlton C. Patterson, Jr., 783 1/2 High, Birmingham, chairman of the Oakland County Chapter. The chapter had submitted statements of commendation to the National Awards Committee in Washington, D. C.

IN MAKING the presentation, Patterson paid tribute to the recreation authorities in several townships throughout the county for providing water safety training to reduce mishaps and fatalities in Michigan waters.

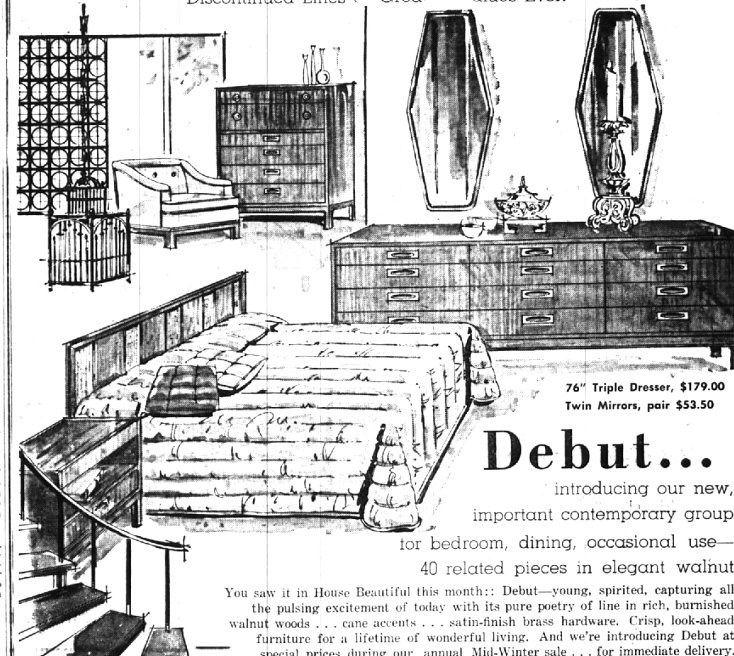
