Notice to Oakland County Board of Supervisors: You are advised to exercise greater caution and more deliberate consideration on matters of such magnitude as the proposed county airport...

Both men missed last week's commission meeting, when Commissioner Carl Ingraham—one of Birmingham's four supervisors—said he looks favorably on the proposal to develop what could become a \$50 million metropolitan airport...
