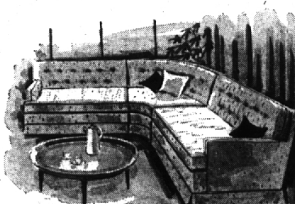

The Paganini Quartet sponsored by the Cranbrook Music Guild will be heard in concert at 8:30 p.m., Tuesday at Cranbrook House. The artists, Henri Szostak, Stefan Kravik, Albert Gillis, and Lester Kapelle, play on four fabulous Paganini Strads reassembled after a century of dispersal following Paganini's death.
