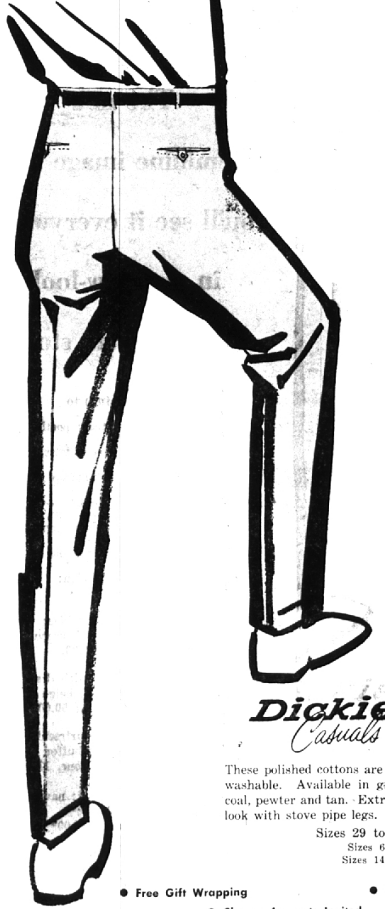
### FRANKLYN DONEGAN Play to Benefit Baldwin Library
