Plans for Northbrook include seven classroom additions, library with workroom and storage space, audio-visual aids workroom and lavatories.

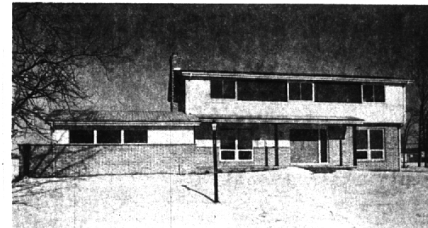

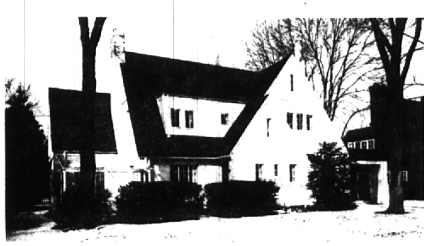
