

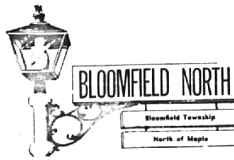
**S'field High Teacher
May Go to Italy
In Exchange Project**

SOUTHFIELD — A Southfield High teacher has been tentatively approved by the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare to be an exchange teacher to Italy for the 1962-63 school year.

Robert DiGiulio, Latin and English instructor at the local school, would be replaced by an Italian teacher under provisions of the Fulbright Act. Principal Robert E. Hall revealed this week. The Southfield Board of Education endorsed the plan and the credentials of the Italian teacher, C. Maria Luisa, of Milan, at a recent meeting.

Born in Altadena, Italy, DiGiulio has lived in Detroit since 1938, coming to Southfield High three years ago. He is currently taking courses toward a Ph.D. degree at Wayne State University.

Final details of the arrangement are still subject to approval by both teachers.

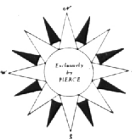
