

# Court Suit over Horse Involves Local Man

**BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP**—The life of a horse is the stake in a suit involving Earl D. Ross, 240 W. Hickory Grove, and the Hartford Fire Insurance Co. Paradoxically, Ross, an attorney, represents the company in the course of his practice of law. The suit is against the livestock division of Hartford.

At a hearing scheduled for last Friday in Wayne Circuit Court, the insurance company was to be asked to show why it should not be permitted to destroy the horse, Contemporary. Ross carried a \$3,000 policy on her.

**THE LOCAL attorney** contends it is costing him \$75 a month to care for the nine-year-old chestnut mare who he claims permanently injured her right foreleg last June. The horse later developed navicular disease, a bone inflammation, and should be destroyed, he says.

**NOTICE OF ANNUAL ELECTION VILLAGE OF BINGHAM FARMS**

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE VILLAGE OF BINGHAM FARMS:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at the Annual Election to be held in the Village of Bingham Farms on March 12, 1962, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., the following shall be submitted to vote of the qualified electors of said Village:

**Proposal Number 1**  
Shall Chapter XIV of the Village Charter be amended to provide as follows:

Section 1. Public lighting and water systems or supplies shall not be constructed, provided or maintained, unless the proposed lighting, water systems or supplies shall first have been approved by three-fifths (3/5ths) of the electors voting at any general election or at any special election called for that purpose.

Section 2. The Council may determine that the whole, or any part of the cost of the acquisition, construction, replacement or improvement of any sewers or drains or facilities for the disposal of sewage or drain water shall be defrayed by special assessment upon the property especially benefited, and the procedure, therefore, shall be prescribed by general ordinance.

**Proposal Number 2**  
Shall Section 11 of Chapter IX of the Village Charter be amended to provide as follows:

Section 11. The Council, subject to the applicable provisions of law, may authorize the borrowing of money in anticipation of the payment of special assessments. Such special assessment bonds shall be both an obligation of the special assessment district and a general obligation of the Village. All collections on each special assessment roll, to the extent that the same are pledged for the payment of the principal of, and interest on, bonds issued in anticipation of the payment thereof, shall be set apart in a separate fund for the payment of such principal and interest and shall be used for no other purpose.

Chapter XIV of the Village Charter now reads as follows:

**MAINTENANCE OF VILLAGE UTILITIES**  
Public sewers, drains, lighting and water systems or supplies shall not be constructed, provided, or maintained, unless the proposed sewers, drains, lighting systems or supplies shall first have been approved by three-fifths (3/5ths) of the electors voting at any general election.

Section 11 of Chapter IX of the Village Charter now reads as follows:

The Council, subject to the applicable provisions of law, may authorize the borrowing of money in anticipation of the payment of special assessments made for the purpose of the construction or improvement of highways, streets and alleys within the Village. Such special assessment bonds shall be both an obligation of the special assessment district and a general obligation of the Village. All collections on each special assessment roll, to the extent that the same are pledged for the payment of the principal of, and interest on, bonds issued in anticipation of the payment thereof, shall be set apart in a separate fund for the payment of such principal and interest and shall be used for no other purposes.
