Name Consultant For Planning Job In Birmingham

Carl Ingraham and Ralph Main don't believe in the use of Federal funds for support of strictly local projects. They demonstrated their beliefs again Tuesday night in voting against the appointment of a consulting firm to carry out work made possible by a recent Federal grant to Birmingham of \$22,000 for planning assistance.

However, the other five commissioners voted in favor of naming the firm of Vilcaan-Leman as the consultant. Birmingham's share of the costs is \$3,943 in local services and \$4,622 in cash. The grant was made under the 701 Program of the Federal Urban Renewal Administration. Ingraham and Main have consistently voted against the City's participation in this program.

THE GRANT will help finance such planning work as aerial photographs and topographical maps.

City Building Inspector Named for Birmingham

Birmingham city commissioners Tuesday night approved the city manager's recommendation for appointment of a new building inspector. They approved the hiring of Richard Schlosser, 38, of Pontiac to fill the \$5,500-a-year post. He has been the building official in Commerce Township for almost four years. Schlosser is expected to begin his duties within two weeks to a month. He was recommended by City Manager L. R. Gare. The vacancy had been created with the resignation several weeks ago of Andrew Butt to take a commercial position.

Birmingham city commissioners Tuesday night approved the city manager's recommendation for appointment of a new building inspector. He is a past president of the Southeastern Michigan Building Officials and Inspectors Association and a member of the Building Officials' Conferences of America and Michigan. He served in the Army from 1943 to 1946. He is married and the father of three children. Assistant City Manager R. S. Kenning, who is the City personnel director, said Schlosser was chosen from a field of 12 applicants. From them six were chosen and tests were administered. Then the process was repeated with three applicants, and the manager decided on Schlosser following a complete physical examination.
