**Dr. R. R. McMath, Noted Astronomer, Rites Friday**  
World renowned scientist, Dr. Robert R. McMath, 70, died Tuesday in his home in Lone Pine Court, Bloomfield Hills. He was prominent as a scientist, industrialist, educator and engineer. His greatest contributions were in the fields of astronomy and astrophysics.

Friends may call at Bell Chapel of the William R. Hamilton Co. Thursday afternoon. Services will be 11 a.m. Friday in Christ Church Cranbrook with burial in White Chapel Memorial Cemetery.

**DR. McMATH** retired last July as professor of astronomy at the University of Michigan and director of the University's McMath-Hulbert Observatory at Lake Araba. He was one of the founders of that observatory in 1928 and he designed the telescope there.

Dr. McMath made scientific contributions that included the invention of the solar corona camera and the development of the solar corona spectrograph. He was an aviator as early as 1915, he served as a major in the Army Air Service during World War I. He had made a study of the McMath Manufacturing Co. of Detroit and served as chairman of the board until it merged into Abrasive and Metal Products Co.

**HE IS** a former president of the American Astronomical Society. His degrees include the master of arts from the University of Michigan and doctor of science from Wayne State University.

Survivors include his wife, the former Mary Rodgers Garrison; a daughter, Madeline and her sons, Robert T. and Keary K. Garrison.

**H. Lee North**  
A former resident of Birmingham, H. Lee North, 77, of Mount Dora, Fla., died Friday after a short illness. Retired, Mr. North had been the managing editor of The Birmingham Eclectic and was past editor of the Petoskey Evening News, leaving in 1945. He recently left Birmingham to take a position as project architect with the Hans Mann, John Gray and Mendenhall Firm of Los Angeles.

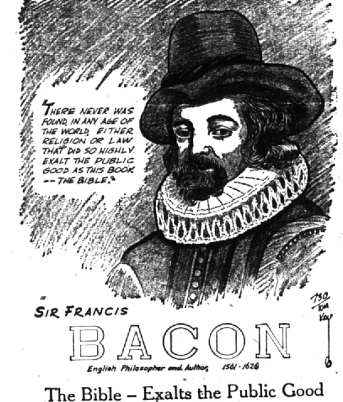
