

Church Sells \$150,000 Bonds For Building

Birmingham Church of Christ Sunday will begin the sale of \$150,000 in bonds to finance its proposed building on Big Beaver near Adams Road.

Bonds will be available to the public at the rate of six per cent interest with maturity dates up to 15 years.

Neil Marshall, president of the Security Plan, Inc. of Fort Worth, Tex., will be on hand Sunday to help the congregation with its program.

THE CONGREGATION, now meeting at 1125 Bannville, has been planning construction of the new building for several months. Preliminary plans have been submitted by architect W. H. and Harman of Port Huron and approved by the building committee. Building committee consists of Morris M. Womack, minister, as chairman, Homer E. McEwen, Estlinger and Richard Hahn.

The new building is the first of three phases of the congregation's building program. The immediate program consists of an auditorium with a capacity of 150, 15 classrooms, offices, nursery and restrooms. Additional classrooms are available for future expansion of the auditorium capacity to about 425. Air conditioning also is being planned for the building.

THE STRUCTURE will be designed in contemporary Colonial style with brick exterior. The entire building will be on concrete level.

Those interested in purchasing bonds may contact G. Wheeler Utley, chairman of the finance committee.

As soon as the architects release the final plans, they will be submitted to contractors for bidding. Construction will follow as soon as possible.
