The Smiths also had stops slated for Disneyland, Knotts Berry Farm, Grand Canyon and the Painted Desert, before their return home this week.

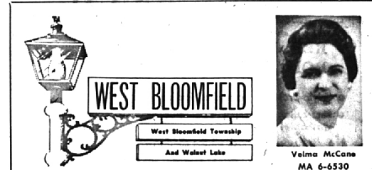

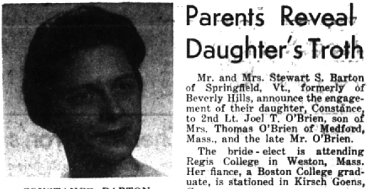

Parents Reveal Daughter's Troth

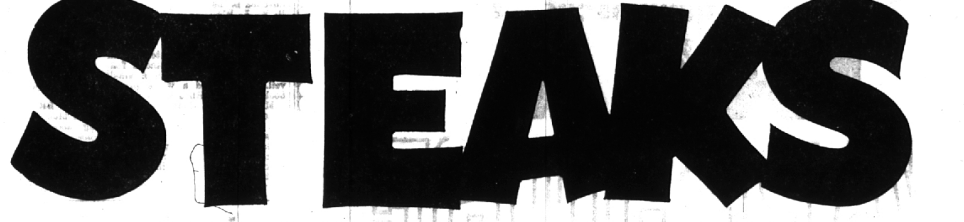

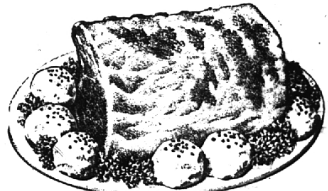
