The Michigan Division of the  
Woman's National Farm and Gar-  
den Association has announced op-  
position to development of national  
shoreline parks without protection  
of property owner rights.  
Mrs. F. Gordon Davis, 1152  
Buckingham, Birmingham, vice pre-  
sident of WNFGA, released the  
following statement last week:  
"Although sympathetic to the  
concept of national shoreline parks,  
the Michigan Division of the Woman's  
National Farm and Garden Asso-  
ciation is strongly opposed to  
development of such parks without  
adequate safeguards to the rights  
of existing property owners."  
"The proposal for creation of the  
Sleeping Bear Dunes National  
Recreation Area as contained in  
Senate Bill 2153 does not contain  
adequate safeguards. Its provisions  
for condemnation of property and  
for zoning regulations are not suf-  
ficiently specific, and the authority  
that would be vested in the Sec-  
retary, depending solely upon his  
discretion, is too broad."  
"It can, as has been stated in

"INDIVIDUAL OWNERSHIP  
of property is one of the most  
cherished rights of a democratic  
society. It is a major tangible dis-  
tinction between democracy and  
other forms of government in  
which the individual has no protec-  
tion against despotism."  
"Moreover, our expanding popu-  
lation and the scarcity of relatively  
undeveloped areas suitable for such  
purposes make it certain that fu-  
ture park and recreational develop-  
ment will increasingly affect indi-  
vidual property rights."  
"The principles established in  
the Sleeping Bear proposal will be-  
come important precedents, and for  
this reason as well as for the pro-  
tection of present property-holders,  
they cannot be too carefully stated."

the value of existing property and  
permanently preserve the Sleeping  
Bear area against exploitation and  
disfigurement."  
"We are fully in agreement with  
these objectives, but we believe that  
the bill in its present form, by  
omission, would not prevent the in-  
voking of zoning regulations for  
less defensible ends."  
"The granting of sufficient au-  
thority to the Secretary of the In-  
terior is essential for practical  
execution of the Sleeping Bear de-  
velopment program, but the bill  
presently envisions the granting of  
almost unlimited power to the  
Secretary, depending solely upon  
his own judgment of the need to  
exercise it."  
"We do not question the worthy  
motives of the present incumbent  
of the National Park Service,  
but we maintain that the omission  
of our traditional checks and bal-  
ances is justified only in the event  
of emergencies such as do not exist  
in this proposal."

"ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS,  
supporters of the bill have stated  
general intentions regarding the  
Sleeping Bear area with which  
there can be little argument. We  
commend this attitude and the in-  
volvement of supporters of S. 2153 in  
a program closely paralleling a  
major objective of our own organ-  
ization."
