

New School at Wing Lake, 14 Mile Roads

BLOOMFIELD—A new elementary school is scheduled for completion this fall to serve the fast-growing area in the vicinity of Birmingham Farms near Wing Lake and 14 Mile Roads. Planned to accommodate 400 elementary students, it will be built on a 12½-are site. One of the Bloomfield Hills School District units, the new school will have 12 classrooms, a library, two kindergartens, a multi-purpose

room, a clinic and an office. Provisions are being made for a possible six classroom addition in the future. Construction costs are estimated at \$450,000 with final total figured at \$553,900 when fees, furnishings and other items are included. The school, being designed by Tarapata MacMahon Associates, should be under construction in a month.
