**Community House
 Courses to Open**

Registrations are now being accepted for some 23 education, craft and hobby courses that will be offered at the Birmingham Community House.

Most of the courses, which range from six to 10 weeks and cost from \$1.50 to \$30, will begin the week of Jan. 15.

An action course in practical politics is an addition to the list of subjects offered, according to Miss Myra Showman, director of adult education. John C. Parker, executive director of the Oakland Citizens League, is the instructor. The course is designed to acquaint students with grassroots politics and theories of political action.

OTHER COURSES available include: accounting, bookkeeping, bridge (beginning, intermediate and continuation), dancing, exercise (for women), first aid, flower arrangement, gardening, home accessories, w.o.r.k.'s h.o.p., millinery, rapid reading, seamanship, and sewing and tailoring.

Languages to be taught are: French, Russian (beginning and advanced) and Spanish.

Arts and crafts courses scheduled include: art appreciation, creative pottery, interior decorating, painting, and silver (enameling and casting).

DANCING COURSES in the youth program will be divided into ballet, modern dance, and modern jazz. Painting and drawing also will be offered for children in all grades.

Commission Asks \$172,000 Road Grant From County Surplus

The Oakland County Road Commission has requested \$172,000 from 1961 county surplus. The request was made before the Ways and Means Committee of the county Board of Supervisors.

The size of the 1961 surplus won't be known for several weeks, it was noted at the committee meeting on Thursday last week.

Road commissioners last February won a \$100,000 grant from the board. The year before they won a similar grant despite opposition by Perendale Supervisor Roy F. Goodspeed who argued that cities pay 68 per cent of such rural grants but must tax their residents for improvements and maintenance of city streets.

Last year, Goodspeed said that only two county townships levied a local tax for roads.
