Special goggles are required while working with the chipping machine which grinds the trees as they are collected. The chipper, which transports some 600 chipped trees in a single load, enables pickup of about 12 times as many trees at a time. Tree chips are used for mulch in city parks, under playground equipment, and for walks and trails in the parks. Tomorrow is the last regularly scheduled day for tree pickups. Crews should be placed at the curbs with stands, wires and nails removed. Residents desiring tree pickups after Friday may call the Forestry and Parks Department for the special brush pickup Tuesday.

California Visitor

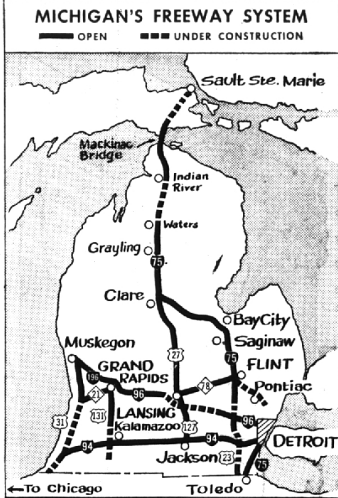

The driver in a hurry is taking the quickest route to eternity.

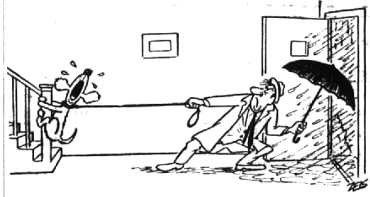

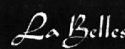


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
