

Completes Course In Minneapolis

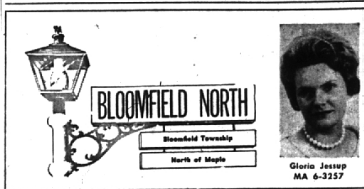

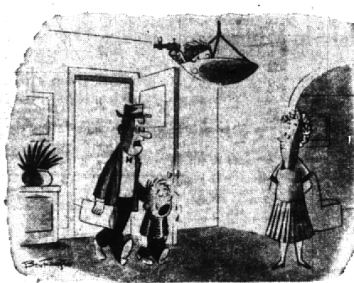
