ORDINANCE NO. 64
AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE COLLECTION OF SEWERAGE CHARGES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD, MICHIGAN.

Section 1.01. The term "Evergreen Sanitary Sewer" shall be construed to mean all sanitary sewers within the Township of Bloomfield, Michigan, which shall be constructed or connected as to sewer directly or indirectly by the Evergreen Sanitary Sewer.

Section 1.02. The term "sewer" shall be construed to mean all sanitary sewers within the Township of Bloomfield, Michigan, which shall be constructed or connected as to sewer directly or indirectly by the Evergreen Sanitary Sewer.

Section 2.01. Debt Service Charge. In addition to the construction charge or any other lawful charge or fee, and notwithstanding any other ordinance or resolution, such premises within the Township, commencing on and after the date of this ordinance, shall pay a debt service charge as follows: (a) Each parcel of property used for other than a single family residence shall pay a debt service charge of \$100.00. Said charge shall be paid by such owner at the time connection is made to any sewer. As an alternative, said charge may be paid by premises on which a single family residential building is located on the effective date of this ordinance after a period of five (5) years, but not over a period of five (5) years, from the date of connection to any sewer. (b) Each parcel of property used for other than a single family residence shall pay a debt service charge of \$100.00. Said charge shall be paid by such owner at the time connection is made to any sewer. As an alternative, said charge may be paid by premises on which a single family residential building is located on the effective date of this ordinance after a period of five (5) years, but not over a period of five (5) years, from the date of connection to any sewer.
