

## Troy Plans CD Training For Feb. 8

Troy Civil Defense will sponsor a second class in advanced hospital practice training Feb. 8 at the Civil Defense Hospital in Royal Oak.

According to Troy CD Director Clarence F. Long, 10 members of the city's civil defense personnel recently completed the first four-week course.

The following persons received training during the two-hour weekly sessions in the preparation of sterile supplies, principles of operating rooms under emergency conditions and conversion of elementary schools into improvised hospitals: Mr. and Mrs. Howard Wells, Robert Schultz, Jr., Thomas Smith, Joseph Wood, Richard Dill, Mrs. Nannie Dill, Mrs. Thomas Tucker, Mrs. Charles Harkness and Mrs. Clarence F. Long.

A SCHEDULE of training classes is being prepared for the various branches of CD training including police, fire, medical and communications.

Enrollment applications may be obtained from the city manager's office in the Troy municipal building on Wattles Road.

Members of Troy's civil defense personnel were addressed recently on "The Role of the Physician in Civil Defense" by Dr. Donald R. Reid of Troy at their monthly meeting in the Fire Hall.
