



Church of Christ Plans New Structure

The congregation of Birmingham Church of Christ, which began meeting at the home of one of its members about eight years ago, today looks forward to its proposed \$150,000 church building. With \$67,500 of \$150,000 in bonds sold during the past week, construction of the first phase of the building program (right side of drawing) has been scheduled for the spring. The nine-acre parcel of

property on Big Beaver near Adams Road will provide space for the main church facility and an auditorium (left side of drawing). The program includes some 50 classrooms for Bible school and educational work. Mr. Morris M. Womack, minister of the church, expects to open bids for the building contracts within the next month. Architects are Wyeth and Harman of Port Huron.

Rev. Gieseke Assumes B'field Baptist Pastorate

Bloomfield Hills Baptist Church begins a new year with a new pastor and church.

The Rev. Harold W. Gieseke of Forest Park, Ill., assumed the pastorate of the Baptist Church Jan. 7, at which time the congregation occupied its new sanctuary at 301 Telegraph Road, north of Long Lake Road.

A native of Illinois, the congregational minister was educated at McKendree College in Lebanon, Ill., where he received his degree, and Washington University in St. Louis, Mo.

HIS THEOLOGICAL education was received from Northern Baptist Theological Seminary in Chicago. Since receiving his divinity degree in 1950, he has been pastor of the Carroll Ave. Baptist Church in Dallas, Tex., and First Baptist Church in Lorraine, Kan., where he conducted a radio ministry.

Prior to accepting the pastorate in Bloomfield Hills, Rev. Gieseke served as secretary of education and publication for the North American Baptist General Conference.

Before becoming a minister, he was interested in the field of science, teaching high school chemistry and mathematics in Illinois. He also worked as a metallurgical engineer for the Ford Motor Co. and Lewis-Mathea Co. of St. Louis, Mo.

REV. GIESEKE and his wife, Mrs. Gieseke, will be joined by the former Hilda Tober of Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, in a home, Gordon Harold, who is in the 8th grade at Vaughan Elementary School.

Mrs. Gieseke, a registered nurse, was a missionary in the Federal Republic of the Cameroons, West Africa, before her marriage.

The Giesekes are residing at 4100 Telegraph in Bloomfield Township.
