With \$87,500 of \$150,000 in bonds sold during the past week, construction of the first phase of the building program (right side of drawing) has been scheduled for the spring. The nine-acre parcel of

property on Big Beaver near Adams Road will provide space for the main church facility and an auditorium (left side of drawing). The program includes some 50 classrooms for Bible school and educational work. Mr. Morris M. Womack, minister of the church, expects to open bids for the building contracts within the next month. Architects are Wyeth and Harman of Port Huron.
