WASHINGTON — Congressman William S. Broomfield (R-Oakland County) recently announced nominees for West Point, Annapolis and the Air Force Academy.

Thirteen Birmingham youths are among the 26 selected as high scorers for the academy of their choice in a competitive examination held last year. From the group will be selected one cadet for the U. S. Military Academy, two midshipmen for the U. S. Naval Academy and one Air Force cadet.

**Baird Speaks On Styling of Future Cars**  
New ideas in power plants and new concepts for tomorrow's highways will be major factors in the styling of future automobiles, Richard F. Baird, Birmingham, a Chrysler Corp. chief stylist, told the Society for Automotive Engineers at Colo Hall last week.

"There will be much more emphasis on styling lines, safety and cut-down air turbulence which, in turn, will cut down the familiar whistle or roar occasioned by higher speeds. If a moderately priced car could travel in relative silence, such as the air-conditioned expensive cars do, the auto industry would be chalked up another positive advancement," he said.

Baird said he believes styling is the greatest single influence affecting public reaction to a car. "However," he said, "today's buyer is more practical in his views. He shows a preference for honest, functional, unostentatious designs. It is the stylist's job to work with aesthetic elements to gain product personality and give the automobile physical fitness as well as beauty."

"The future is exciting for an auto designer," he said, "because the introduction of new types of power plants may be on the way."  
"FRESH NEW appearances in automobiles, wholly new concepts in styling, using ideas we never dreamed of before will emerge because of these new power plants," Baird said.

"The styling of the latest Chrysler car, turbine engine in a 1962 Plymouth and a 1962 Dodge car recently allowed us to gain new character in the grille area because the required cooling dimensions dropped considerably. With reduced engine size and weight, no converter or cooling system, it is now possible for new arrangements of the passenger area, luggage compartment and power train. A new silhouette may result," concluded Baird.
