AT ISSUE is a philosophy, a manner of operation, a way of doing things. Republicans favoring the appointive power were led by Chairman John B. Martin, a former two-term auditor general, and James K. Pollock, political science expert at the University of Michigan. They emphasized efficiency in government and the strengthening of authority of the governor, together with tighter responsibility and accountability.

DEMOCRATS ON the committee, led by Adelaide Hart, Detroit school teacher, and William C. Marshall, executive vice president of the state AFL-CIO, promised to renew their fight when the issue comes to a final vote, then to write a dissenting report and, in the end, fight it on the floor of the convention.

ADDING TO the complexity is the fact that various combinations of appointments are available. Knirk, who favors having the superintendent of public instruction appointed by the State Board of Education and the auditor general by the Legislature, said, "I think the people favoring appointment are sincere, but they are idealists. I feel, from a realistic standpoint, the changes we make should be designed to help us sell the constitution to the people."

THE PRESENT Supreme Court justice, Harry F. Kelly, favored appointment of all six, and Murray D. VanWagoner agreed, excepting the highway commissioner. Both suggested doing away with the "advice and consent" power of the Senate.
