## COLD STUFF

The Trail Blazer's Almanac sets forth the following weather conditions for the couple of weeks:—

Jan. 15 to 18—Rain or snow, blizzards in upper states.

Jan. 22 to 25—Unsettled.

Jan. 26 to 28—Rain, sleet or snow.

Jan. 29 to 31—Cold wave.

McClellan-Ball sets forth the following antidotes for same:—

**BEST:** X-2. A chemical pellet. 30 times the melting capacity of salt. Used properly it will not track into house. Will not injure grass or border plants.

**EXCELLENT:** Calcium Chloride. Faster than salt and much longer melting ability. Better at temperatures, under 20° F.

**VERY GOOD:** Salt. Least expensive melting material. Perfect job in driveway at 20° to 32° F.

**GOOD:** Ammonium Sulphate. A fertilizer with fair melting ability. OK, for walks and steps.

**FAIR:** Sand. A temporary method of getting out of a bad spot. (The others will do as well or better but cost more).

**FOR SNOW ONLY:** Steel or aluminum shovels, steel or aluminum pushers, TORO SNOW HOUND.

**FOR ICE ONLY:** Steel sidewalk scraper.

## HOT STUFF

**FOR GRATES:** Fire Quets, briquettes, charcoal & Cannel coal.

**FOR ANDIRONS:** Kindle-light logs.

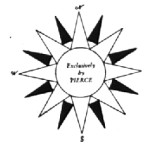

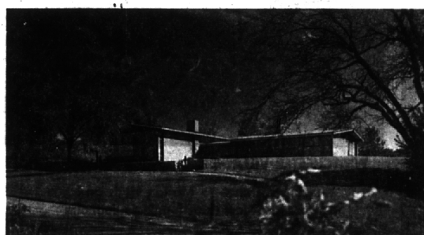
