Oakland Region MEA Workshop Slated Tuesday

Legislation will be the focal point of interest at a workshop for Region 7 (Oakland County) of the Michigan Education Association (MEA) to be held at 3:30 p.m. Tuesday at the Berkley Elementary School.

Major speaker will be Richard Adams, MEA assistant executive secretary for governmental relations, who will discuss various aspects of the association's legislative program for 1962.

KEY AREAS for discussion include: state school support (the MEA is requesting an eight percent increase in state school support based on the net membership allowance), removal of the 21-year limitation in the definition of membership, extension of the state school district aid to \$11,000 to be paid on formula rather than by the present table, school district reorganization, an appropriation of \$300,000 to the public school adult education program of the state, group life insurance for school employees, a minimum salary of \$4,800 for qualified teachers, and other benefits, such as terminal leave pay and sick leave allowance.

WILLARD ROGERS, principal of the Berkley Elementary School and legislative chairman for Region 7, will conduct the workshop.
