slowly sprinkle your plants, back and forth.

The newspaper on the floor will take the insects on the floor and within five minutes your plants will respond to this treat. It is amazing how fast the pesticides are absorbed and how much benefit from the performance as well as the leaves.

WATERING YOUR PLANTS is a personal affair. At my typewriter, I can't give you a rule. Just use your finger to feel the soil, and when it appears dry, water the plant. Only by experimenting will you get to know the watering tempo just right for your home humidity and plant selection. More plants have "lost their lives" due to too much Tender Loving Care than vice versa.

FERTILIZING your plants can be done in many ways. You may place a plant tab in the soil which looks like an aspirin and as the plant is watered it will feed the roots.
