These women, along with nine other professional and semi-professional models, donate their time as their regular contribution to provide work for handicapped people in the metropolitan Detroit area.

Regular pianist for the show is Mrs. Paul Hultgren of Beverly Hills. The Goodwill show is believed to have the longest run of any in Detroit, playing to 20,000 people in seven years and still booked solidly through 1963.
