Associates Honor B'ham Osteopath At Annual Meeting
 Dr. John B. Wood, 866 Ludgate Road, Bloomfield Hills, was one of three osteopathic physicians to receive distinguished service awards last week during the 66th annual convention of the American Osteopathic Association at Las Vegas. Dr. Wood received the highest honor of his profession for outstanding service in osteopathic education and organizations.
 The other two osteopathic physicians honored were from Chicago and Des Moines, Iowa.
 A FORMER president of the association and of the American Osteopathic Academy of Oculopodiatrists, Dr. Wood was named a fellow of the American College of Osteopathic Surgeons in 1960. He is a past president of the Michigan Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons and a past member of the State Board of Osteopathic Registration and Examination.
 Dr. Wood has been a clinical professor of orthopedic surgery at the Chicago College of Osteopathy and Surgery since 1949.
 HE IS NOW a senior attending surgeon in orthopedic surgery at both Pontiac Osteopathic Hospital and Detroit Osteopathic Hospital. He was formerly chief of staff at the Detroit hospital.
