The Falcon's of Groves had their wings clipped Friday as they lost 67-54 to a sharp-shooting Cherry Hill outfit.

The loss dropped Groves from a second place tie in the Tri-River league.

## B'field Barons Down Clarkston

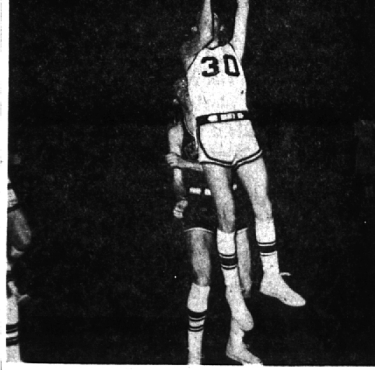
Four free throws in the last minute of play enabled Blountfield Hills to cue out a 26-24 victory over Clarkston.
