Last week commissioners banned parking on three streets. A few weeks ago, they were confronted with a residential parking problem in the Eton-Buckingham area.

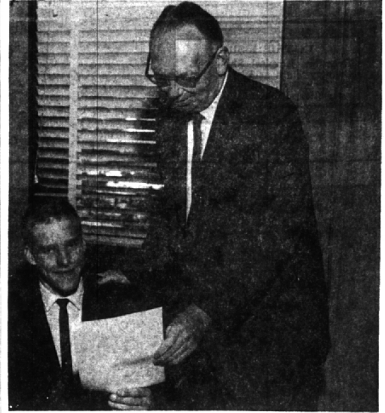

**BEVERLY HILLS**—Village Attorney Thomas J. Dillon was instructed by the council to prepare the necessary resolution to condemn a strip of land, approximately 150 by 300 feet, adjacent to the village office on Thirteen Mile Road, west of Southfield.

The property is owned by William Gilmore, of 32075 Waltham. Gilmore turned the village's most recent offer of \$3000. The village requires the land for future use.

Dillon was asked to have the condemnation resolution ready for the next council meeting July 16. Council meantime instructed Councilman John A. McManahan to meet with Gilmore for further discussion of the offer.

**BEVERLY HILLS**—The council adopted ordinance 68 controlling use and type of land fill at its meeting Monday. The ordinance also controls dumping of rubbish and prohibits garbage fill.

Philip Hampton, office manager of Johnson and Anderson, village engineers, reported on the progress of the two remaining stations at 13 Mile and LaSalle.

Both stations are 90 per cent complete, he said. The village has paid \$25,500 so far on the two stations, and \$5,000 remains to be paid when the work is complete.
