Enrollees in one of the college's four-year degree programs can complete their studies in three years through participation in the summer sessions.

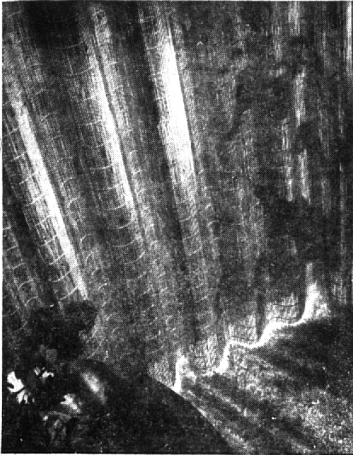
## Touring Western Michigan Campus

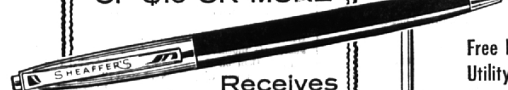

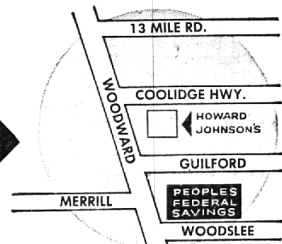

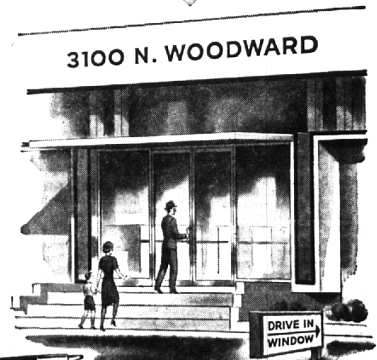
