## Polish-American Clergy Struggle Yearbook Theme

The story of the labors and sacrifices of the Polish-American Clergy in America and throughout the world serves as the theme of the 25th volume of "The 1962 Eagle," annual student publication of the Orchard Lake Schools, Orchard Lake, Michigan.

Consisting of 256 pages, the handsome book also reviews pictorially all phases of student life in each of the three divisions—SS, Cyril and Methodius Seminary, St. Mary's College and St. Mary's Preparatory. The book's central idea is the school's motto, "Initium Scientiae Timor Domini — The Beginning of Wisdom is the Fear of the Lord."

AVAILABLE TO THE public in reprint form, the theme of the book presents a chronological study of the untiring efforts of the Polish-American Clergy from the time the United States was a mission territory to the present day. The Polish priest's contribution as an educator, author, missionary, and religious, are highlighted.

Three pioneer Polish priests are especially noted by the book for their work in the early days of the church in America. They are: The Rev. Thomas Praniczewski, the first Polish priest in America; the Rev. Leopold Sobczynski, the first pastor of a Polish foundation in America; and the Rev. Joseph Duchowski, founder of the Seminary at Orchard Lake.

CHARLES E. BOROFSKI, of Webster, Mass., was editor-in-chief and Anthony Halat, of Detroit, assistant editor. Business and assistant business managers respectively were Walter E. Ferrett, of Old Forge, Pa., and Ervin Jaskolski, of Detroit, Michigan.

Albert Noyer, an art instructor in the college department, designed the book and the Rev. Walter Ziemia, Dean of the College, was faculty adviser.

THE SCHOLARSHIP pays \$1200 every two semesters and is awarded to an outstanding entering student who is interested in political science or law and a career in government service.

The choice is made on the basis of academic performance, personal qualities, and promise.

Similar scholarships will be awarded in each of the next three years.
