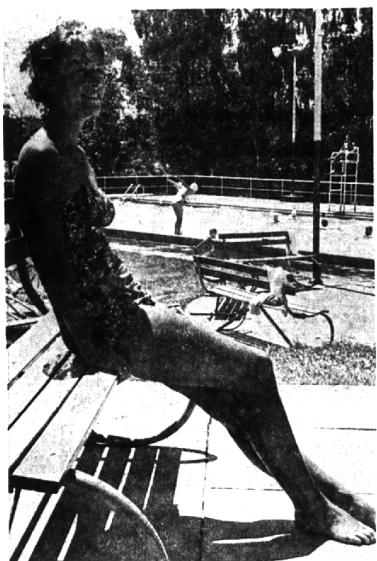


Country Clubs Hit Summer Pace
