

Two No-Hit Contests Pitched in Little League

Little League action last week was featured by a pair of no-hit-ers and two scores in astronomical figures.

Tom Fraas and Bob LaFave combined to pitch the Minor Federal League Maroons to a no-hit 8-1 victory over the Oilers. Then three Falcon hurlers in the same league, Al Wason, Don Nelson, and Mark MacGivudin, paced Fall team teammates to a 23-1 triumph over the hapless Angels, not allowing a single hit.

MINOR and T-Ball Leagues saw some unusual scoring. The Minor League National Bulldogs crushed the Colts 21-0, and the T-Ball League American Comets humiliated the Boiler-makers 35-3.

In Major League games, the Wolverines in the Federal League won the Spartans 10-game winning streak, 3-1, behind the 3-hit pitching of Brad Host.

about four miles wide and six miles long, and they have a veritable fox factory out there. Clark attributes the rise in fox population on the Club property to the residential development that is taking place in Bloomfield Hills.

"When the hounds are loosed, they quickly try to pick up the spoor of a passing fox; and then they are literally off and running."

"Frequently, the spoor will be several hours old," explained Clark, "but the hounds follow it anyway, and we get the thrill of taking the jumps in hot pursuit because we don't know if the spoor might not be two minutes old."

"THE FOX runs in a great circle and eventually ends up back in his own hole. When this happens, the hounds will pick up the spoor, and we are off again. We hunt like this for four or five hours; and then it's back to the club house for, ahem, breakfast."

Clark emphasized that he has been in on three kills in the 20 years he has hunted and implied that they have lost almost as many hunters as hunted in that time. The odds, it seems, favors the fox.

The future for fox hunting at BOH is not bright, Clark, vice-president of a life insurance company, sadly related. Advancing civilization and expanding suburbia will soon take the hunt out of Bloomfield Open Hunt as it has at the Grosse Pointe Hunt.

CLARK, 63, gives it another two or three seasons; and then the only hunting that goes on a BOH will be in the bar and around the swimming pool.

Many of the horses used during the hunting season were shown at last week's Detroit Horse Show.

"They're beautiful animals, Clark sighed wistfully. "You ought to see them in action."

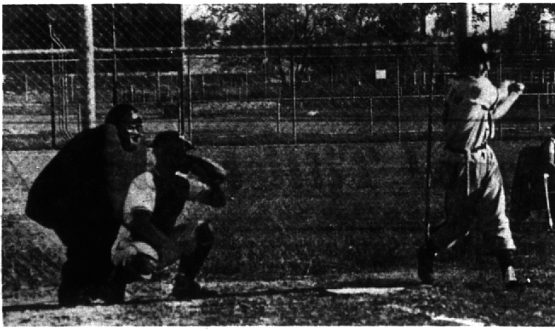

The faltering Red Sox dropped their second straight in the second half to the Indians by the embarrassing score of 15 to 5 with John Kingscott getting the win and Bill Canham the loss in the Friday contest.
