## Bids for S'field Paving To Be Opened Tuesday

Bids will be opened Tuesday by the Oakland County Road Commission on the \$600,000 Southfield Road expansion project. Announcement of the awarding of the bids will be given at the first formal commission meeting the following Monday. Construction is to start 10 days later. Widening of the road is to run along a 2 1/2-mile stretch from 9 1/2 Mile Road to 600 feet north of 12 Mile. It will run through Lathrop Village and part of the city of Southfield.

WORK IS EXPECTED to be completed by Nov. 1, though completion of minor work, such as seeding, is not expected to be finished until close to the termination date set at May 15. According to William Mercer, assistant chief engineer of the Oakland County Road Commission, heavy traffic has necessitated widening which will expand Southfield Road from 20 to 60 feet. The road will eventually include two lanes in each direction and a center lane for turning.

## Civil Service Exam Results Announced

A State Civil Service Commission study of its 1961 examination procedures showed 900 different examinations given during the year to over 55,000 persons with 22,093 receiving passing grades. It was the second largest examination load in the commission's history.

Examinations varied in content and included any one or all of four parts: a written test, oral interview, evaluation of education and experience, and a performance test. Some examinations also included a field investigation of personal background and other factors.

THERE WERE 6,676 appointments to both temporary and permanent positions. Of these, 2,425 were promotional appointments of career persons already in state jobs who qualified for promotion by examination.

Last year the Civil Service Commission ordered a study to determine if the Commission's promotional examination policy, which limits applicants for higher level positions in many cases to persons already in the state service, was causing "inbreeding" or closing the door to outsiders.

## Chester-Wallace Hearing Delayed

The public hearing on necessity for the proposed Chester-Wallace relief sewers has been postponed indefinitely. Birmingham city commissioners Monday night tabled a motion to declare no necessity for the project and then adjourned the hearing without date.

COMMISSIONER Charles Renfro requested the city manager to check with public health authorities on the possibility of a health hazard in the area due to sewers backing up. Residents in the area have objected to the project, claiming that there has not been flooding to warrant new sewers.

## Eastways Farms Sold; Subdivision Planned

National Investment Corp. of Birmingham has bought Eastways Farms in Bloomfield Hills from Mrs. Francis Palms. Fred Pierce, Inc., Realtors, 460 S. 13th, Woodward, Birmingham, sold the 30 acres of property on Eastways Road.

The property will be subdivided into one-acre lots and will be sold by Pierce Realtors as soon as they are platted. Homes will be restricted to approval of the plans and specifications in writing by the corporation. The merit of building plans and drawings when submitted will be judged by an architectural committee which will remain anonymous.

## Enlistment Program

The U.S. Navy's three-year enlistment program will be continued indefinitely, according to Chief R. A. McCarty, naval recruiting officer in Royal Oak. Enlistments for four and six years are also open to young men between 17 and 21 years of age who qualify physically and mentally.
