State Police Report Traffic Deaths on Rise

Michigan's traffic deaths in June climbed to 137, the highest toll since 1955 and 27, or 24 per cent, more than 114 in the same month a year ago, according to State Police provisional figures.

The June average for the 12-year period of 1954-65 was 120. The toll in June of 1955 was 102, the highest on record.

The June fatalities give the state a six-month toll of 641, which is 57, or eight per cent, less than 701 in the same period in 1961.

MICHIGAN'S STRING of months' reductions in traffic deaths, which provisionally had been expected to continue through May, was cut off at six when delayed death reports pushed the March count to 114, or one more than 113 in the same month of 1961.

More complete figures for May showed 116 deaths, and 8,239 injured in 16,423 accidents. These represented a drop of 17, or 15 per cent, in fatalities compared to the same month a year ago while the number injured increased 927, or 11 per cent, the accidents went up 1,528, or 10 per cent.

The accumulated record for the first five months of the year includes 507 deaths and 37,562 injured in 92,342 accidents. These represent a 14 per cent reduction in deaths but increases of 14 and 20 per cent, respectively, in injured and accidents, compared to the same period in 1961.

Estimated mileage for the first four months, the latest information available, was 104 billion, a gain of 18 per cent compared with the same period in 1961, while the death rate of 28 per 100 million vehicle miles was down 19 per cent.

CON CON WEEKLY REPORT

Unified Court System Assured

The concept and philosophy of a unified state court system—from the supreme court down through local courts of limited jurisdiction—was set forth in the proposed Michigan Constitution.

All Michigan judges continue to be nonpartisan elective officials and the governor may not name appointees to fill judicial vacancies. It was the convention's judgment that the present system which permits the governor's appointees to run for election with the incumbent judge had an overwhelming tendency to result in what amounts to an appointive judiciary.

Under the proposed new constitution, vacancies in the judiciary may be filled by supreme court appointment from among retired jurists in the state. These appointments will be ineligible for election to the posts to which they are temporarily named.

A SIGNIFICANT addition to the present judicial system is the establishment of a nine-member intermediate court of appeals with jurisdiction immediately below the supreme court. The new court is intended to speed administration of justice in the state.


