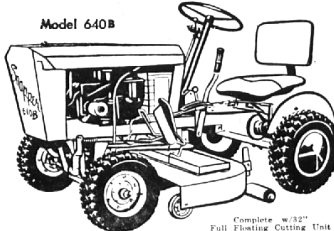

DB&T Reports Slight Drop In Earnings

The Detroit Bank and Trust Co. has reported net operating earnings for the first six months of 1962 of \$1,044,274 equal to \$2.10 a share. This compares with \$5,253,438 for the first half of 1961 which, after giving effect to the five per cent stock dividend paid earlier this year, equals \$2.72 a share. The announcement was made by Joseph M. Dodge, Chairman, and Raymond T. Ferting, president.

A substantial increase in interest payments to savings depositors was chiefly responsible for the reduction in earnings. Gross income was higher than last year but interest paid in the first half of 1962 amounted to \$7,887,926 compared with \$4,788,749 in the same period of 1961. It should be remembered that savings interest rates were raised twice during the past year—in June 1961 and in January 1962. Current rates of 4 1/2% on regular savings accounts and 4% on one year time deposits compared with 4 1/2% and 4% respectively in effect during the first five months of 1961.

TOTAL DEPOSITS were \$69,048,872 on June 29, 1962 compared with \$96,527,098 a year ago. Demand deposits represented \$49,200,511 of that figure, up \$7,312,714 from last year. Savings and time deposits increased to \$19,748,361 from \$47,326,587 a year ago.

Total loans were \$176,197,986, up from \$188,273,824 a year ago. Loans and discounts were \$104,137,050 compared to \$281,945,445, and real estate loans were at a record \$172,969,606 an increase from \$156,372,879 on June 30, 1961. Total capital funds, including good credit reserves, were \$98,237,019 showing an increase of \$5,516,182 from June 30, 1961.

Birmingham Area Students Train at Advertising Agency

Two residents of the Birmingham area, both students at Northwood Institute, Midland, have begun summer jobs with Campbell-Ewald Co., Detroit, as part of a college co-operative training program for students interested in advertising.

They are William Morse, of 3435 Devon Brook Drive, Bloomfield Hills, and John Kychala, of 2020 N. Pine Creek Drive, Orchard Lake. They are among 14 students from four Michigan universities and colleges who will work two months as advertising interns, under tutelage of topflight creative advertising agency officials. The training program is in its fifth year.

The students receive college credit as well as salaries, and will return to their college campuses in the Fall to complete their senior year.

Lathrup Resident Promoted by Ford

Appointment of H. C. Grant, 19020 Bungalow, Lathrup, as general operations manager, foundries, was announced today by M. L. Kettle, general manager of Ford Motor Company's engine and foundry division.

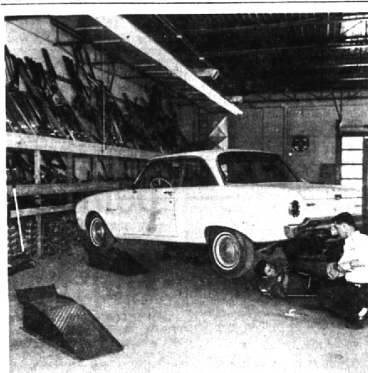

CITY OF BIRMINGHAM ORDINANCE No. 580

AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.3 OF ORDINANCE NO. 527 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM AND THE ZONING MAP, BY ADDITION OF A SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 3.3-27.

THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM ORAINS:

Section 1. That Section 3.3 of Article 3 of Ordinance No. 527 be amended by addition of a section to be known as Section 3.3-27, said Section to read as follows:

Section 3.3-27. Property on Oak Street described as Lot 249, except the westerly 4 ft. of Birmingham Heights Subdivision shall be changed from its present classification of R2 Single-Family Residential Zone District to R4 Multiple-Family Residential Zone District.

Section 2. The Zoning Map attached to Ordinance No. 527 shall be deemed modified to incorporate this change.

Ordained by the Commission of the City of Birmingham this 9th day of July, 1962, to be effective upon publication.

2 Area Men Head Firm Getting Army Research Contract

Two Bloomfield Hills men are executives of a Detroit firm which has been awarded a \$30,000 research contract by the Army. The firm is F. E. Parsons Corp., 1656 Keller Lane, and William J. Scripps, 602 Bennington Drive.

The F. E. Parsons Corp. won the contract for installation and test of its jet unit. It will be tested in an Army Otter amphibious vehicle.

THE CHIEF development engineer at the Detroit Arsenal, Paul E. Van Thiel, said that the Parsons unit is one of several that the Army is testing.

Van Thiel said that if size and cost of the units are reduced sufficiently they could be installed in vehicles to cross water. The jet device seemed to be the best power unit, he said.

Parsons, president of the firm, said the system takes water from under the boat. It is then forced by a pump at high speed from the back of the vessel, with a conventional engine providing the power. The jet stream can be turned to maneuver the vessel. It eliminates the propeller and permits the boat to operate in shallow water.

THE DETROIT FIRM hopes to get a production contract from the Army, according to Parsons.

Scripps, vice president of the company, has done most of the test work in a 28-foot speed hull, which has been conducted on the Detroit River for more than a month.



B'ham Woman First to Fill New Position

In a move emphasizing an increasing importance in public service at WXYZ-TV, the station has created the position of public service coordinator.

John F. Pival, president, announced this week that Alice Limperis, 1612 Southfield, Birmingham, has been named to fill the position.

Pival said that Miss Limperis would represent WXYZ-TV in liaison functions with public service agencies in the Greater Detroit area and would coordinate the station's services to the agencies.

MISS LIMPERIS' duties will require her to work closely with the station's promotion, program and news departments in scheduling of public service time and the creation of special projects for public and private agencies.

Miss Limperis is a graduate of the High School of Commerce and the Detroit Business Institute. She attended the University of Detroit before going to work in the legal department of the General Motors Corp. in 1950.

She joined Campbell-Ewald Co. in 1952 and became Pival's executive secretary in 1958.
