also was the appointment of a coordinator of foreign languages to help strengthen and supervise the foreign language curriculum.

IN LINE WITH studies made prior to the November special election, the board also reduced the debt service levy from 7.4 to 5 mills. This action completes the shift in emphasis from holding to an improved instructional program, approved by the voters in the November election.

In other action, the board approved a request to the Municipal Finance Commission to transfer \$8,700 from the paid up 1950 debt fund to the 1950 debt fund.

The fund was originally established to finance construction of the original portions of Southam High School and Torry Elementary School as well as additions to Walnut Lake and Franklin Elementary Schools.
