BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP—Bloomfield Township Fireman Jerry Tewilliger had more than his share of inhalator runs last month. Of the 15 resuscitator calls made to the township's three fire stations during June, Tewilliger was on duty when nine of the calls came in. He responded to all nine.

Use of the fire department's resuscitator is constantly on the increase and has become an important duty of the department. The 15 runs in June are up from the 9 calls for the same month a year ago.

Most of the calls are for heart attacks. However, once in a while, the oxygen is needed to revive a case of "cote too many."

1962 Official Michigan Highway Map Off Presses

The 1962 Official Michigan State Highway Map is off the press, the State Highway Department reports. State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie said nearly 2,000 copies have been made on the map since last year, mainly the result of 225 miles of new freeway that were opened to traffic in Michigan during 1961.

In addition, detailed strip maps of the state's major freeways are being made for the first time this year. They show location and design of freeway interchanges.

This year's highway map has nine color photos on the front and back covers, including pictures of the Capitol Building, the Soo Locks, the Mackinac Bridge, Interstate 75 Freeway in Northern Michigan and other scenic views.

Mackie said 200,000 copies of the new map have been printed by Rand McNally & Co. of Skokie, Ill.

Highest priority has been given to distribution of maps to nearly 25,000 individuals who have written in recent weeks asking for a copy of the map.

At the same time, bulk shipments have gone out to tourist associations, chambers of Commerce, hotels, and companies, travel bureaus and others.

Third International Bridge for Michigan

By the end of this year, Michigan should be joined to Canada by another new international bridge.

This summer will find construction at its peak on the new bridge between Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., and Sault Ste. Marie, Ont. The target date for completion is Nov. 1.

When the Soo bridge is complete, it will be Michigan's third direct highway connection with Ontario. The other two are the Blue Water Bridge between Port Huron and Sarnia, and the Ambassador Bridge between Detroit and Windsor.

The Blue Water Bridge was in the news recently when its tolls were cancelled. The Ambassador Bridge still imposes tolls and so will the new bridge at the Soo.
