

'Brokers' Selling For DACCW Drive

Two Birmingham women are 'brokers' in a unique scheme of marketing shares in the 31st NCWC national convention coming to Detroit Nov. 3-7.

Sponsored by the Detroit Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women, the program is designed to collect the shares for financing the largest single meeting of Catholic Women in the world for convention participation.

In each parish or organization connected with the DACCW, a volunteer broker is equipped with "stock certificates" and has the suggested minimum goal of securing 100 investors.

UPON RECEIPT of a 50 per cent investment, the broker will issue one stock certificate to the purchaser.

Birmingham brokers are Mrs. I. S. Heintz, 392 Pilgrim; and Mrs. John T. Higgins, 180 Pilgrim.

Once receiving a stock certificate from their broker, the stockholder may purchase as many shares as 50 cents apiece as he wishes. While the certificates have no cash value they will be the means of admission to some specially designated activities prior to and during the convention.

New Catholic Parish Arises in B'field Twp.

Construction on two buildings for a new Roman Catholic parish, King Lake School from June 21 in Bloomfield Township began on Monday.

Known as St. Owen's, the parish will be located on Franklin Rd. Total cost of the two buildings, one a combination church-social hall and the other a rectory for housing the clergy, will be approximately \$200,000.

The parish will administer to 450 families, and will be under the supervision of Fr. Edward Walling.

FR. WALLING cited a definite need for the new Catholic parish. "There are so many people who live in the Bloomfield Township, Franklin Village area," he explained, "that church services have been moved to two different schools within the past month to meet space demands."
