Here is the Aug. 7 primary ballot as it will appear on voting machines in the third district of Oakland County. Although the Michigan Supreme Court has invalidated the state senator portion of the election, the candidates will

appear on the ballot. In event the court's ruling is upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court, the levers will be locked so no one can vote for them. If a stay of the order is granted, the levers will be unlocked and voters can make their choices.

Then the state legislature will take up reappointment in its session beginning next January. In a primary election like this, of course, electors must vote either Democratic or Republican; they cannot vote for candidates in both parties.

Contests in the Democratic primary are for Congress, 18th district; county sheriff; and county drain commissioner. Republican contests are for lieutenant governor; state senator; and drain commissioner.

## Resident Sets World's Record

A 38-year-old Birmingham man set an unofficial world record at the 31st National Model Airplane Meet in Chicago. The man is Philip W. Kintworth, Jr., 894 Brooklawn, Birmingham. He is a Chrysler Corp. executive. In keeping his model plane in the air 15 minutes and 51 seconds, he gained the first world's record the United States has received in the event for four years. Kintworth won the same event last year in national competition at Willow Grove, Pa.

OFFICIALS from the Academy of Model Aeronautics in Washington, D.C., said the Academy would probably approve the record within a few days.

Also, since the Aeronautique Federation Internationale la-Paris gives its approval, Kintworth will be eligible to enter international competition.

At the meet were 1,800 participants from 45 states, Mexico, Canada and Belgium. Kintworth's wife and two daughters, however, were not there. They were in Seattle visiting relatives.

## Lathrup Sets Sale Date for Sewer Bonds

LATHRUP—In order to speed construction of the storm water sewer program, the council Monday moved the Aug. 20 meeting back to Aug. 13. Storm water sewer bonds are scheduled for sale on the latter date.

Mindful of the importance of constructing storm sewer lines under and along Southfield Road before the beginning of the widening of that road by the county, City Administrator Gerald Stone said the Aug. 13 meeting "would be a full evening."

Stone said the county road commission was scheduled to award the bid Monday for the road widening but tabled action.

LATHRUP WOULD have faced the problem of immediately signing the storm sewer contract with Lakeview Excavating Inc., Roseville, if the road commission had let the contract, Stone said. In that case, the road work would have begun within 30 days, necessitating prompt laying of the Southfield Road sewer lines he commented.

Stone said he had already asked the contractor for a date on which work could be started on the sewers in the Southfield Road area—involving about \$50,000 in construction costs.

If the contractor had begun work on Tuesday of this week as proposed, Stone said, the council would have had to sign a contract at Monday's meeting. With the tabling of the county bids, the city will get a breather and can sign the contract at the Aug. 13 meeting, in time for mid-August storm sewer construction according to Stone.

THE CITY administrator said the city engineers, Ayres, Lewis, Norris and May, representatives of the county road commission and the Michigan Municipal Finance Commission also would be present at the meeting which will be held at the city offices at 7:30 p.m.

The council approved submission of plans and specifications for extension of existing water and sanitary sewer lines in California Subdivision 5, owned by Mrs. Kelley in the state health department.

## Refrigeration Law Raises Few Questions

Should Birmingham send applicants for refrigeration contractors' license to Detroit for examination?

City Commissioner Carl F. Ingraham raised this question Monday night in connection with the city's proposed refrigeration code ordinance.

As outlined, the new law would require applicants to take their tests before the Detroit board of examiners.

"DO WE SEND anybody else to Detroit to get a license through Birmingham?" Ingraham asked.

"Why can't we give the examination here? Why send a Birmingham man to Detroit to get an examination?"

It's a matter of that city having qualified personnel to give the necessary tests, opined Commissioner William E. Roberts.

"At the present time we don't have the facilities," said City Manager L. R. Gare. "I'm not saying we don't have the talent here, if we can find it."

INGRAHAM ALSO questioned a stipulation calling for payment of a fee for appealing a decision made by the building inspector.

It hasn't been the City's policy to levy a fee for appeals, he said. Gare was instructed to obtain questions on the ordinance and to report next week.

Once the commissioners give tentative approval to the ordinance, it will be submitted with others for inclusion in the new codification of the city's laws. Then all of them will be up for adoption.

## Set Aug. 27 For Hearing On Road Bill

LATHRUP—Aug. 27 was set by the council Monday night for a public hearing on a 12 Mile Road rezoning amendment.

The amendment will permit rezoning from residential to transitional-professional (TP-2) of a portion of one block of 12 Mile, between Guy Place and the alley west of Southfield.

The rezoning will also include a parking greenbelt for a portion of the same area.

The hearing will be held at 7:30 p.m.

A council study meeting will be held afterward, at which time the members will review merit pay raises for city employees.
