

West Bloomfield Barn Destroyed In \$3,000 Blaze

WEST BLOOMFIELD—Approximately \$3,000 damage was done Tuesday morning when fire destroyed a barn at 2665 W. Orchard Lake Road, Sylvan Lake Village. No one was hurt.

The building was owned by Nicholson Beverage Co. and was being rented to the Hayes Feed and Pet Supply Co., which was using it as a warehouse. The structure contained fertilizer and seed.

Cause of the blaze is still undetermined. Immediately alongside the barn were several gasoline storage tanks.

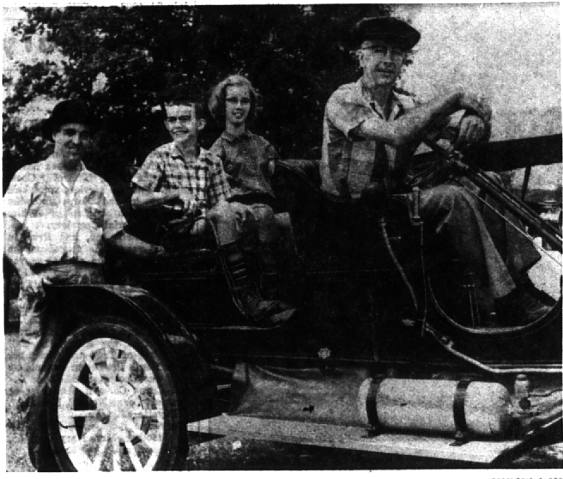

Family Service Announces Plans For New Building

Plans to construct a 4,800 square foot, bi-level building to house Family Service of Oakland County and the Oakland Planning Division of United Community Services of Metropolitan Detroit, was announced this week.

The site of the building will be at 2321 Twelve Mile near Berkley Street.

The announcement came from Robert J. James, director of Family Service, and from Charles Mentzer, director of the United Community Services.

WHEN COMPLETED, the building will make possible a merger of the Birmingham and Royal Oak offices of Family Service of Oakland County.

The Birmingham office staff is expected to move from its present location at 188 Oakland to the new building on Oct. 1.

This move will be made for administrative saving and for greater convenience for the people in the area," James said.

"In addition," he continued "it is the realization that sometime we will have to give greater service to the 10 township areas of the county."

Northland Construction Co. of Detroit will build the structure.

Zoning Board Gives Okay for Store to Erect-Large Sign

Plan District Caucuses in 2 1/2-Weeks

Oakland County GOP Legislative District caucuses will be held in each district on Monday, Aug. 13 at 8 p.m. according to Charles L. Lytle, county chairman.

These caucuses are held for the purpose of selecting delegates to the State Convention from each district for approval at the County Convention scheduled at Pontiac Northern High School on Wednesday, Aug. 15 at 8 p.m.

The State GOP Convention will take place on August 21-25 at Cobo Hall and the Statler-Hilton Hotel in Detroit. Oakland County has been allotted 140 delegates and 110 alternate delegate seats for the State Convention based on one delegate for each 1,000 votes cast for the Republican ticket in 1960.
