

'Illiterates' Apostle' Talks at First Baptist

Known as the "apostle to the illiterates," Dr. Frank Laubach will speak at a Bible study in Birmingham-wide service at the First Baptist Church at 8 p. m. Wednesday, June 13.

Dr. Laubach, world-famous Christian missionary, is the originator of the method to promote literacy known as "teach one teach one." As a result of his teaching method, more than 50 million people speaking 200 different languages and dialects have learned to read in their own language.

The services, open to the public, will be held at the Sanctuary.

DR. LAUBACH went to the Philippines 32 years ago as an educator-missionary. He reduced the savage Moros' Maranan language to writing. To their joy, he worked out the prototype of his picture-word-syllable literacy charts.

Since Dr. Laubach did the same thing with 20 different languages and dialects in the Philippines, Dr. Laubach was thus catapulted into a career as one of the most traveled men in the world.

He works with educators, government officials and missionaries in 101 countries and in 300 languages and dialects. He perfected simple textbooks to teach adults to read easily. He is the author of numerous other books and pamphlets.

"It is no use talking to illiterates about freedom if we do not help them," Dr. Laubach said. "They ask: 'What do you mean? Freedom to starve? We are hungry because we are ignorant. We want to learn to read.'"

Dr. Laubach is helping them.

Bloomfield Hills Baptist Church Dedicates Building

The Bloomfield Hills Baptist Church will dedicate its new building at 3600 Telegraph Road just north of Long Lake Road with three festive services Sunday, June 10. Formal dedication services will be held at 3 p.m., with Dr. Charles W. Koller, president emeritus of Northern Baptist Theological Seminary, Chicago, Illinois, bringing the dedicatory address.

Services will also be held at 11 a.m., when Dr. Koller will speak; and at 6 p.m., when the dedicatory address will be given by Dr. A. Dale Irie, pastor of the Grosse Pointe Baptist Church, Grosse Pointe Woods, Michigan. The Grosse Pointe Church has sponsored the Bloomfield Hills church since its organization early in 1960.

AT THE afternoon service, greetings will be extended by Mr. Homer W. Case, Township Treasurer, for Bloomfield Township; Rev. E. Arthur McAugh of Ebenezer Baptist Church, Detroit, for the North American Baptist churches of Greater Detroit; Rev. Robert Shelton, First Baptist Church, Pontiac, for the churches of the community; and by Dr. Irie on behalf of Grosse Pointe Church.

After the service, the ladies of the church will serve refreshments to all guests in the church's Fellowship Hall.

THE NEW building is a combination chapel and educational wing, which provides for a congregation of 180 and a Sunday School of approximately 200 at the present.

It is the first unit in a projected building plan that will include a larger sanctuary on the 4.4 acres the church owns on Telegraph Road.

Frederick J. Horner was the architect; L. & R. Custom Construction, Inc. of St. Clair Shores, Mich., was the general contractor. A joint building committee from the Grosse Pointe and Bloomfield Hills churches supervised the construction.

Total cost of the new structure, including property and insurance on notes, is approximately \$105,000,000.

THE BLOOMFIELD Hills Baptist Church was organized on March 8, 1950, when nine families of the Bloomfield Hills area placed the possibility of beginning an evangelical Baptist work in the area.

Rev. O. W. Stucky served the church from that time until the end of 1961, when the present pastor, Rev. Harold W. Gieseke, began his ministry.

Ground-breaking at the present site was on July 24, 1961, and the cornerstone was laid on October 22, 1961. Services have been held in the new building since Sunday, January 7 of this year.
