NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the Annual Election to be held in Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, on Monday, June 11, 1962, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time, the following propositions will be submitted to vote of the qualified electors:

Election of One Trustee
For the election of one trustee for a term of four years, expiring June, 1966. The candidates who have filed proper nominating petitions are:

Bernard E. Sullivan

Proposition to Renew Previously Approved Operating Millage
As a renewal of the increases heretofore authorized by the qualified electors of Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2 for operating purposes, shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in the School District be increased by seven and six-tenths (7.6) mills of the fully equalized valuation of the School District for a period of fifteen (15) years, the years 1962 to 1976, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for operating expenses, said renewal to supersede and cancel the increases heretofore approved for operating purposes?

Proposition to Increase Operating Millage
For the purpose of providing additional funds for operating expenses, shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2 be increased by three (3) mills of the fully equalized valuation of the School District for a period of fifteen (15) years, the years 1962 to 1976, inclusive?

Bonding Proposition
Shall Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of erecting and furnishing a swimming pool and building to house the same and appurtenant facilities in the School District?

Each person voting for trustee of the board of education, and on the millage increase propositions must be—
(a) A citizen of the United States of America over twenty-one (21) years of age;
(b) A resident of the State of Michigan for six (6) months and of the School District for thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election.

Each person voting on the bonding proposition, in addition to the above qualifications, shall be qualified to serve as trustee within the School District, or be the lawful husband or wife of such person.

In addition, each person voting on any of the above propositions must be a registered elector of the City or Township in which they reside.
