# Who I am $\dots$ and why I'm running for the Birmingham **Board of Education**

A great number of people, I imagine; don't know any of the candidates in the Board of Education election next Mon-day, which is kind of a shame. It prob-ably accounts for the fact that very few people go to the polls in a school election unlest there is some much sublimitation. people go to the poins in a school election unless there is some much publicized issue at stake. If they don't know much about the people, it is difficult to become interested in the outcome. I think apathy is also the result of uncertainty by the voters. Not knowing the candidates, they feel that their votes might even go to the wrong man if there were one. Going to the polls might seem to be an unproductive effort under those cir-

We have lived in the school district a little over six years. Because the school building program was only just underway when we moved into our home, we have probably seen more of the school system than most people. Our older son went into Bloomfield Village School, then to Frankin School Village School, then to Franklin School for a year, and finally to Valley Woods to finish elementary. He is now in Derby Junior High. Our daughter attended kindergarten at Franklin, then moved to Valley Woods followed by our younger son who started there. As you can see, we have had a fairly broad view of the school district.

I am sure it is not hard to understand I am sure it is not nard to understand that the primary basis of my interest in running for election to the Board of Education stems from having three children in our schools. But there is another reason for it that has an earlier beginning. I decided in college to become a teacher. I cardiated from Sturfood. beginning. I decided in confege to necome a teacher. I graduated from Stanford University as a History Major and then, as required in California, did a year of graduate work in the Stanford School of Education to earn a General Second-ary Teachers' Credential. While going to school, I coached football for two to school, I coached football for two years in a public high school near Stanford. I also did my practice teaching there in History and Geography. I got a job in advertising in the summer before starting as a regular teacher. I never did get to teaching, though I intended to. I have been in the advertising business ever since.

I have a feeling that my background in education will help me to do a more effective job as a member of the Board of Education than I might without that experience. I don't want to make too much of it, because I'm not sure how much it will help, but I think it is something you ought to know about me.

husiness and to some degree, education.

My point of view is that of a parent and taxpayer. This combination of background and viewpoint has led me to do a lot of thinking about educational needs in the country as a whole and more particularly about our own community. I have a conviction about what comes first. These are must hines that make first. There are many things that make hirst. There are many things mat make up a school system, but there is only one thing that is essential to good education. No mystery about it. Good teachers! Fine schools, a good adminis-tration and a thoughtful curriculum are helpful to good teachers, but these things can't produce excellence in education without good teachers. I think communities like ours, to a greater degree than others, rather expect excellent schools. To me it means finding and holding excellent teachers. That is over simplifying the problem, I suppose, but I will stand by the objective.

If I am elected, I intend to make the If I am elected, I intend to make the job of upgrading our teaching staff my first concern. Please understand that I am not critical of the school administration's efforts in this area. On the contrary, I think a very good job has been done to date, I want to help with it. been done to date. I want to help with it. And, I want to be on hand to make sure that the emphasis on our teaching staff is maintained in future years. It is so important. Yet, sometimes emphasis is hard to maintain when things are going well in one area and other problems have to be faced.

I think I've covered the pertinent points about myself. I have coached and managed teams in the Little League, and I am on the Board of Directors of a camp for boys, but I really haven't done a great deal in the way of com-munity service. I'm not much of a joiner, which I suppose accounts for it.
