Old Fort Adds 'History Tunnel' As New Attraction

A new sightseeing attraction has been added to Michigan's reconstructed Fort Michilimackine an underground "tunnel of history". The 18th century fort is located in Mackinac City on the northern tip of Michigan's lower peninsula, and the stoked looks out across the Straits of Mackinac.

The underground exhibit is unique in archeology and museum display history, according to the Michigan tourist council. It extends from the basement of a restored brick building, through a tunnel covered last year. A series of murals are ranged alongside "in-place" archeological exhibits showing the various earth strata of the French and British occupation as they were excavated. Typical artifacts lie in the various layers and their use is graphically illustrated by the adjoining murals.

AS AN EXAMPLE, a pair of dice found in a late British layer of sand are shown being played by members of the King's Regiment in an accompanying mural.

The "tunnel of history" ends in a restored French well on the exact site where it was uncovered.

The summer of 1962 will be the fourth consecutive season of the Fort Michilimackine archeological digging program. The restoration phase this year is centered in the southwest corner of the fort, where, 18th century maps indicate, a row of British traders' huts and enlisted men's houses were located.

The traders' huts and enlisted men's houses were built and occupied from about 1761 to 1781. There is a good possibility, archeologists believe, that the remains of earlier French structures lie beneath these sites. This could provide the diggers with a sequence of household goods, articles of personal ornament and weapons from a time possibly as early as the fort's beginnings around 1715 to its final abandonment in 1781.

During the last three digging seasons, archeological crews have discovered some 100,000 artifacts and, armed with records of the site and circumstances of their finding in connection with old foundations of stone and wood, have paved the way for restoration of structures of the period of 1769—that of the British occupation, which followed the French.

Village Police Plan to 'Hound' All Prowlers

FRANKLIN—Village police will make a "dogged" effort to catch prowlers in Franklin.

Marshal John Donaldson announced Monday night that the excellent tracking talents of a Bloomfield Township's big German Shepherd will be available to assist his 15-man volunteer force.

With prowler calls on the increase in recent months, the police have decided to use the highly-trained animal through an arrangement with the Bloomfield township department.

Controlled by his police master, the huge dog is trained "to kill on command." Franklin police said the dog will be immediately available to them when called about a prowler.

The following resolution offered by Edmund Webb and seconded by John A. Jones, Jr., and adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin, Michigan, is hereby published for the information of all persons interested in the estate of said deceased.

1. That the Village Council hereby proposes that Chapter XIV of the Village Charter be amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER XIV MAINTENANCE OF VILLAGE UTILITIES

Public sewers, drains, lighting and water systems or supplies shall not be constructed, repaired or maintained, unless the proposed sewer, drains, lighting and water systems shall first have been approved by two-thirds (2/3) of the voters voting at any general election provided, however, notwithstanding the foregoing, and notwithstanding any other provisions in this charter to the contrary, the village council upon approval by a resolution adopted by two-thirds (2/3) of the members of the Village Council, may contract with the County of Oakland and with any other village, city or township in said county for the acquisition, improvement, enhancement, extension, repair and maintenance of the Evergreen Sewerage Disposal System, as now or hereafter established and owned, including the purchase of sewage disposal services from said county and the acquisition of sewer trunks and arms to connect this village to said system.

2. That the Village Clerk shall submit a certificate of the date of the election to the Governor of the State of Michigan for the approval or disapproval of said amendment.

That a special election is hereby called to be held in the Village of Franklin, Oakland County, Michigan, on Monday, the 10th day of September, 1962, from 7:00 o'clock A. M. to 8:00 o'clock P. M., Eastern Standard Time, for the purpose of submitting the foregoing charter amendment to the electors for their adoption or rejection, and that the polling place for said election shall be located as follows:

Franklin Fire Hall—2747 Franklin

3. That the Village Clerk shall give notice in accordance with the law of the registration of electors after the date of the election, and shall publish the same notice in each of the Birmingham Eccentric, the Oakland County News, the general circulation in the Village of Franklin, Oakland County, Michigan, and by posting the same in at least two public places in said village.

4. That the Village Clerk shall give notice of the proposed charter amendment by publishing the same twice in the said Birmingham Eccentric and Southfield News. That the said notice of special election shall contain in full with existing charter amendments, which would be altered or abolished thereby. That the first publication of said notice of special election shall not be less than two (2) weeks nor more than four (4) weeks prior to the date of the election. The said notice shall also be posted by said Village Clerk in ten public places in said village.

5. That the proposed charter amendment shall be placed upon the ballot in the following form, with provision for voting "yes" or "no" upon the adoption thereof, to-wit:

SHALL CHAPTER XIV OF THE CHARTER OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN, BE AMENDED SO AS TO PERMIT THE VILLAGE COUNCIL TO CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF THE VILLAGE TO ACQUIRE, IMPROVE, MAINTAIN, EXTEND, REPAIR AND MAINTAIN THE EVERGREEN SEWERAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM AND TO ACQUIRE, IMPROVE, EXTEND, REPAIR AND MAINTAIN THE ACQUISITION OF SEWER TRUNKS AND ARMS TO CONNECT THIS VILLAGE TO SAID SYSTEM?

That said proposed charter amendment in full shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the polling place together with the existing charter provisions to be altered or abolished thereby.
