Nine Boys, Five Girls Attend Wolverine States

Nine boys from the Birmingham school district, all high school juniors were elected to attend the 25th annual Wolverine Boys' State at Michigan State University campus June 14-21.

Sponsored by the American Legion, the annual event is held in the participation of the Michigan governmental system, and to give them an opportunity to personally meet government officials. Personnel this year is limited to 1125 outstanding youngsters.

This year Michigan was one of forty-nine states which held a Boys' State convention. Since it began in 1937, over 100,000 boys have attended Boys' State with 128 of them representing the

Michigan school district. This year 1125 boys will be attending from both the upper and lower portions of the state.

TWO BOYS are selected each year from each state to attend Boys' National, which is held in Washington, D.C. These boys are chosen by their fellow citizens at Boys' State. Tom Towler of Troy High School was chosen for this year. The expense for the trip to Boys' National are paid by the American Legion.

Richard Dewey is the Birmingham chairman of a Boy's State as he has been for the American Legion Post 11 since it began in 1937. He has been the district chairman five times.
